Points to remember in making reservations:

- June 2, 2016, is the deadline for the special rates of \$135 plus taxes (king suite) and \$145 plus
 taxes (double suite), as well as the deadline for TSO to meet our guaranteed block. Rates are
 good for up to four people per room.
- Reserve only the number of rooms that you need. You must give the names of all the persons
 who will be staying in the rooms you reserve. Guests will be allowed to make only one
 reservation per guest name.
